- 4. Council discussed language examples regarding allowing pigs as pets in the city limits. They generally agreed to limiting them to potbelly pigs, one per household and requiring them to licensed in the same manner as dogs. City staff will prepare official language to consider at the next city council meeting.
- 5. Council discussed the memo regarding available funds for purchasing gravel road equipment. Council agreed to revisit the idea in October or November as suggested by the City Clerk.
- 6. Council discussed the Park Board's request to create an exemption in the Development Regulations that would allow a Park Host to live in an RV at Mc Murphy Park in order to provide park security. Council agreed and authorized city staff to move forward with researching and providing language options for this type of exemption.
